5 Titles You Need to Know.



TITLE V: MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

This title sets into law a number of miscellaneous provisions to protect people with disabilities as well as make certain exclusions.

Some signification provisions include:



Prohibiting retaliation, intimidation, coercion, or threats against those who seek to exercise their rights



Guaranteeing the ADA does not supersede or invalidate federal, state, or local laws that provide equal or greater protections



Requiring insurers and healthcare providers to be consistent with state law



Directing certain federally agencies to develop, produce, and disseminate information on technical assistance

Title V also excludes certain groups of people from protections under the ADA as they are not considered impairments. These groups include, but are not limited to, drug abusers, compulsive gamblers, kleptomaniacs, among others.
